Frost Construction Update

You have probably noticed that the construction fence is already partly installed! The kids are very excited as they see changes happening each day.

Later this week, the building site will begin to be cleared. The Kindergarten wing will be prepared for demolition. The Kindergarten classrooms and the covered play area are scheduled to come down the last week in June.

You will notice that some trees will soon be removed from the construction site. *I know* it is hard to see trees coming down! Please be assured that we have been very dedicated to keeping absolutely as many trees as possible. Some trees need to come down because they have been determined by an arborist not to be healthy trees or in a healthy location. Some trees need to come down because they are in the way of the new building. And some trees need to come down because it will be necessary to re-grade this site (ie raise up the back part of the site so it is more level) and they cannot survive this process.

Next week, the main Cornerstone job trailer will be moved on site. This is where the Cornerstone General Contractors people will be housed.

Again, I urge you to discuss with your children the importance of staying on the "safe" side of the construction fence. The construction site will be a dangerous place.

The Big Toy at the northeast corner of our property will be available for neighborhood use throughout the summer and the construction year.
