Third Grade News!

In third grade this spring, the students have just finished learning about the structures of life and we're excited to begin our next science unit, Physics of Sound. The students will have lots of opportunities to have their hands on many different and unusual instruments of sound. We'll be learning about pitch, frequency, and vibrations.



In math, we've really been doing a lot of work on combining (addition) and comparing (subtraction) strategies. The students have been working on double (or sometimes triple) checking their work. We're about ready to begin work on area and congruency with 2D shapes and then we'll begin our work on fractions.

We are going to be starting to write poetry. The students will be exposed to many different types of poems and also will be writing their own. We're also going to continue our work on writing five paragraph essays as well as some more procedure writing.

The students just finished up their first experience with the WASL! They all worked really hard and had a positive attitude each day. Most said it was easier than they thought it would be. We really do appreciate all the parents who made sure that their children were here on time, rested and ready to go!
