Important notice for parents of 2008-09 6th Graders!

Please see below for the immunization requirements for the 2008-09 school year.

Your student needs to have received the vaccines below in order to begin school in the Fall.

1. Tdap- (tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis) 1 dose of the vaccine if the student is 11 years of age and if it has been at least 5 years since the last DTaP, DT or Td.
2. Varicella (Chickenpox) - 1 dose of the Varicella vaccine unless your student has had the disease. The vaccine must have been given on or after the first birthday. If your student has had the Chickenpox, you will need to notify the school of the date of disease.

Please note that students that are not properly immunized will not be allowed to start school in the Fall.
